#### Principal's report: Lance Johnson- Principal

#### 1. Volleyball

It is nice to see and hear the sounds of kids practicing in the gym in the mornings and after school. We hosted two games at our school last week and both went well. I had to turn two parents away that brought another sibling with them to watch but they handled it okay. The Return to Sports rule for elementary is one person per athlete.

#### 2. Budget

I will share our school budget with you at next month's PAC meeting. The 1701 process is complete so we can finalize things now.

#### 3. Parent Conferences

Students are dismissed at 11:30 on October 28<sup>th</sup> and October 29<sup>th</sup>. Busses will run three hours early. We will use our same bookings system for the conferences and information will come out to parents on Monday. There is a two-week window from October 25<sup>th</sup> to November 5<sup>th</sup> where parents may choose to have their conferences during that time. Some teachers may reach out and offer that directly to parents. At yesterday's staff meeting, teachers decided to have the parent conferences during the afternoon and evening of Thursday, October 28<sup>th</sup> at 12:00-4:30 and 5:00-7:00.

#### 4. Halloween (Louise)

Halloween continues to look different at schools because of the Communicable Disease Plan in the district. We have two teachers trying to problem solve a way that we can do a costume walk, as was done prior to covid. We are hoping to make it happen. Please remember that someone's culture is not a costume. Fake weapons aren't allowed at school as well.

#### 5. October 22<sup>nd</sup> Provincial Professional Development Day

This day is provincially-based and teachers have a choice for their professional development that day.

#### 6. November 12th School-Based Professional Development Day

Our staff developed two new school goals at the end of the school year last year. Our plan is to work on these goals for the next 3 to 4 years. Our two school goals are:

- 1. To increase reading comprehension of all students by developing students' ability to communicate and think critically about their reading
- 2. Increase our school community's awareness and understanding of racism

Over the summer, our teachers read the book, White Fragility: Why it's so hard for white people to talk about racism. The professional development day in September was a school district wide focus on Indigenous Truth and Reconciliation. We also did a lot of work as a staff and school toward Orange Shirt Day and the assembly that was held. This all focussed on our 2<sup>nd</sup> goal.

Our Professional Development Day on November 12<sup>th</sup> is school-based. For this day, we will work on our first school goal.

Our primary teachers will spend the morning with our school district Vice Principal of Early Learning, Jen Friessen. Our school is purchasing the book <u>Reading with Meaning: Teaching Comprehension in the Primary Grades</u> by Debbie Miller for all of our primary teachers. They will work on this book with Jen in the morning and then create lesson plans based off the book in the afternoon. The Vernon Primary Teachers' Association is hosting Reggio and Nature school's Liz McCaw. She will be talking about story workshop. Some of our primary teachers will be at that session during the second part of the day.

Our intermediate teachers will spend the morning with our school district curriculum coordinator, Scott Belshaw. Our school is purchasing the book <u>The Reading Strategies Book</u> by Jennifer Serravallo for our intermediate teachers. They will work with this book with Scott in the morning. Kim Tyssen is the professional development leader at our school. Her, Scott and I are each creating one lesson from this book and sharing it with the intermediate teachers so they can see how we can utilize this book in our classroom. I prepared my lesson early so I can share with you what the latest literature is telling us to do with our students.

Our professional development day on January 28<sup>th</sup> will focus on our 2<sup>nd</sup> school goal as that day is a school-based professional development day as well.

Marnee M. sent her regrets as she was unavailable to attend. Report was presented by Amanda C. Gaming funds in the amount of \$8980.00 for 2021/2022 have not bee received yet but are expected soon. The District will be paying for the retro fit to make our primary playground inclusive, so gaming funds that were set aside can now be allocated to purchases this year.

#### Ongoing Business: Amanda Connor

Halloween Event- Trish H. reported that the primary wing and the intermediate wing will be decorated. Decorations will be tailored to each wing. Treat bags will be made for all students using Butcher Boys credit. If anyone would like to help with the decorating, please contact the PAC.

Amendments to the constitution- Amanda C. presented the updated constitution to include the possibility of having Co-Presidents/Chairpersons. This constitution was signed before the membership by Amanda C. and Rachael M. and will be sent to the district to have on file.

Tuesday Hot Lunch- Dawn L. and Katrina J. reported that the first Tuesday Hot Lunch was well received by students, parents and staff. They asked that student volunteers be made available to help deliver the lunches to classes. They also asked that there be assistance in the primary classes to hand out the food as they are not labeled and there was some confusion as kids took lunches that were not theirs. The PAC asks that all parents remind their child if they will or will not be receiving a lunch to minimize the confusion.

#### New Business: Amanda Connor

Bambora Fees- These fees have been absorbed by the PAC since the inception of the HotLunches. Net website at BX. The PAC decided in May that these fees will now be charged to parents when ordering on the site as the PAC can no longer absorb the fees. This will begin at the start of the  $2^{nd}$  Term. The fee charged to parents will be \$0.25 + 2.8% per transaction. The PAC advises parents to consider ordering lunches for a whole term to minimize the fees charged.
