Principal's report: Lance Johnson- Principal

1. Track and Field

- a. We are back to our regular practice of having a zone track meet against 3 other schools and the top 3 finishers in each event advancing to the district championships
- b. The track meets will be held at the college track facility
- c. BX put our name in to run a school track meet and we were not selected for this year. There were too many applications to accommodate everyone.
- d. Our intermediate teachers are meeting to organize something at our school.

3. Kindergarten Registration

- a. One of the positive things that happened over covid is that our students built up some independence by entering the school on their own, carrying their own backpack, putting it in their locker by themselves, getting organized on their own etc.
- b. We saw positives in the afternoon as well. Students had to get their own stuff ready, carry their bags themselves and meet their parents outside at a meeting spot. Also, the school day went longer. When parents are in the hallway waiting for their child, it gets louder and students get distracted and learning shuts down......that's what I mean by the school day going longer.
- c. We would like to maintain the current practice of having parents say bye to their kids at the door and wait at a prearranged pickup spot outside at the end of the day.
- d. A negative for students in regards to independence has been waiting in a line-up outside until a teacher comes to get their class in the morning, at recess and at lunch. Starting on April 20th, students will enter the building at their current doors when the bell rings. They won't need to wait for a teacher. The exception to this will be with Kindergarten. Our Kindergarten classes will wait in line because it provides a time for our new parents to connect with the teacher if needed.
